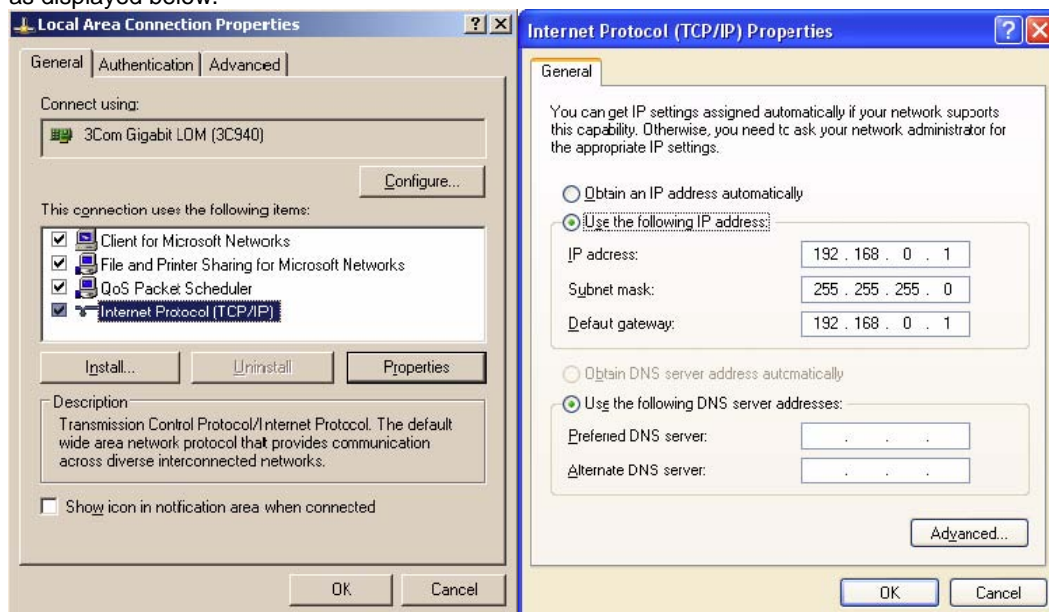


Connect your Xbox to your PC www.promods.co.nz 021 683-439

Once your Xbox has been modified, it will be ready for FTP file transfers. If you have a PC with a network card or onboard LAN installed, you will be able to connect your PC to your Xbox, to transfer media or files, or enable your Xbox to access the Internet. You will require a 'network crossover cable' (cat5 with RJ45 plugs) to connect directly from your PC network port to the network port on the back of the Xbox. Use a standard network cat5 cable if using a hub or switch. The official Xbox system-link cable is just a crossover cable, you can purchase a crossover cable for less than \$10 from most computer shops.

You need to set your PC up to be network ready. The following relates to Windows XP, if you use any other operating system, please use this as a guide only. The following settings will enable you to use all features listed in your Modified Xbox guide. I recommend you use these settings. If you wish to use your own IP addresses & settings, I cannot guarantee all features will work.

Go to 'Control Panel', then 'Network Connections'. You should see a Local Area Connection Icon. Right-click on this icon and choose properties. Double-click 'Internet Protocol (TCP/IP)'. You should see the windows as displayed below.



Select 'Use the following IP address:', and enter the settings below:

IP address: 192.168.0.1

Subnet mask: 255.255.255.0

Default gateway: 192.168.0.1

Click Ok, then click Ok again, and your PC will be setup for FTP transfers.

You now need to load an FTP program which can access and communicate with your Xbox.

A 30 day free trial FTP program called FlashFXP can be downloaded on the internet here:

Download and install FlashFxp. (Please note 'dawnload' is the correct spelling)

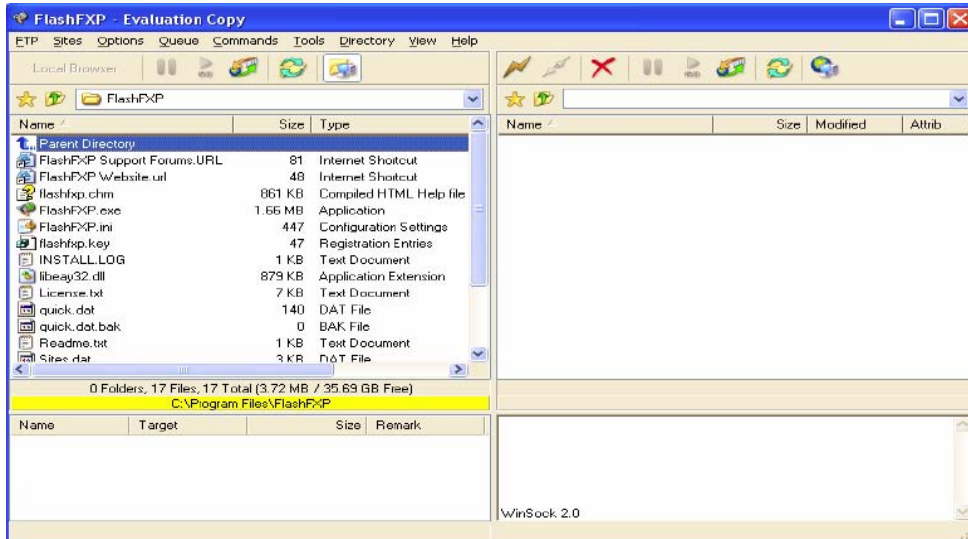

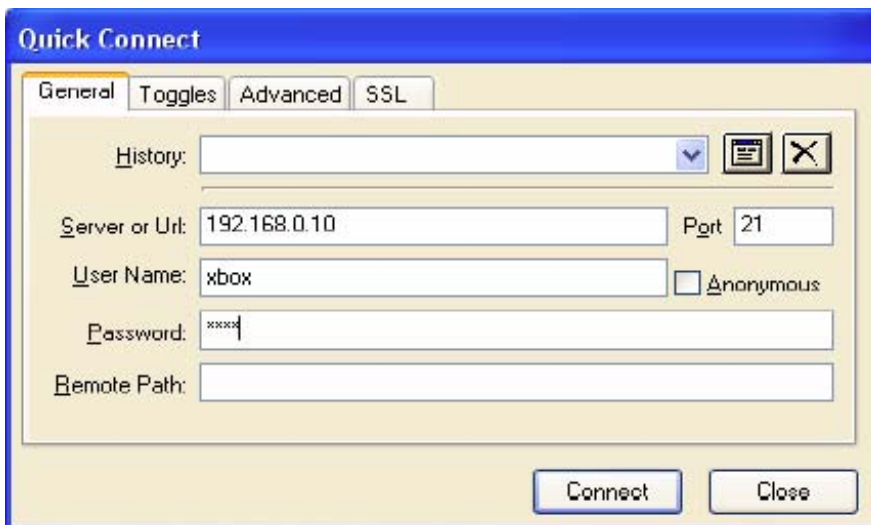
Xbox setup:

Connect your crossover cable from your Xbox to your PC, you may need the AV cable plugged into the XBox.

Procedure: Your XBox should be powered up. The Xbox has been set to the IP address '192.168.0.10'. Open FlashFxp (or your preferred FTP program).



Press F8 to open the 'quick connect' screen



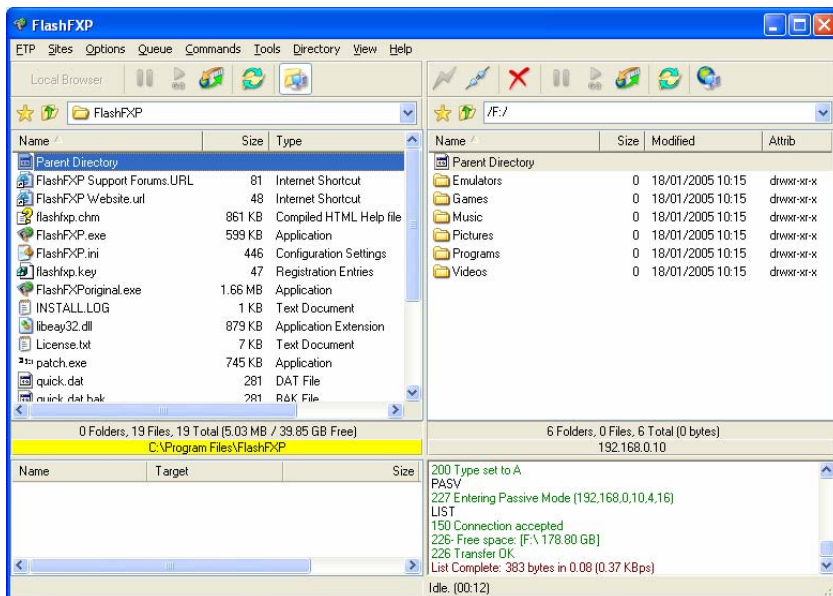
As above, type in the XBox IP address 192.168.0.10, **username: 'xbox' & password: 'xbox'**.

Then click 'Connect'.

You should now see your Xbox FTP folders on the right hand side. Transfer files from your PC on the left side to the appropriate folder.

Eg. For Movies (MPG, AVI DIVx etc) transfer into Movies. For MP3's or WMA transfer into Music etc.

(Xboxes that have not had their hard drives upgraded may have 8Gb hard drives. In this case you will not have any FTP access as the standard 8Gb drive is too small).

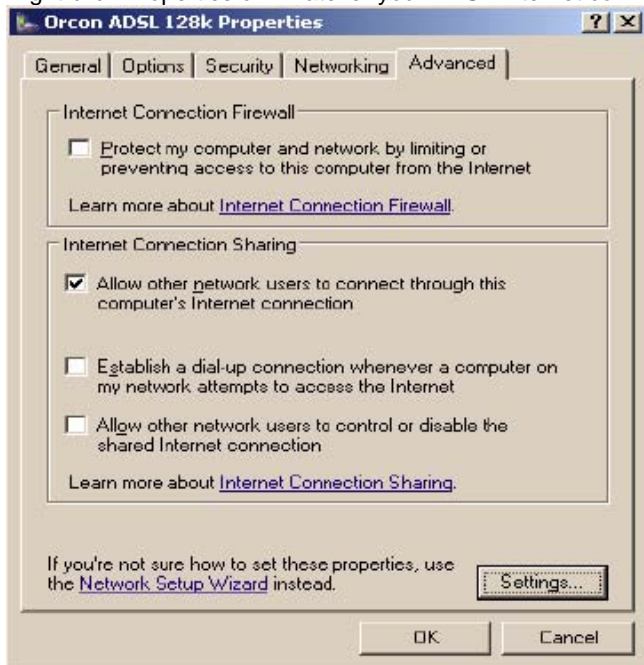


XBox Internet Access:

If you wish to have your XBox able to access the Internet to use the 'Weather' function, perform IMDB lookups for media, or connect to an online gaming service, you will need to share your Internet connection.

To do this, go to Control Panel, then Network Settings.

Right-click Properties on whatever your ADSL Internet connection is, eg. Orcon 128k ADSL.



Choose the Advanced tab then select the Internet Connection Sharing checkbox as above. Your choice if you want to select the other boxes. Now whenever your computer is on and connected to the Internet, your XBox will be connected. Do not select any XBox Live tabs if the modchip is on.
